

MATHEMATICS MINOR

The minor in Mathematics provides students with an understanding of the concepts and principles of applying computational tools. Students will be exposed to a range of mathematical tools with a specific focus on the techniques that are useful in other fields of study, such as the sciences. The minor is especially valuable for students in Natural and Social Science fields who want to develop a deeper understanding of how mathematics can instruct decisions.

The minor is not solely, or even primarily, for Natural Sciences & Mathematics majors. Students from many allied programs, including Kinesiology, pre-Nursing and Education, often pursue minors within the Division. Students interested in acquiring a minor for teacher certification should first consult with their academic advisor and the Education Division.
