The Provost collaborates with other public institutions and the Idaho State Board of Education in the development and implementation of statewide higher-education academic policies.

Institutional Disclosure for Programs Leading to Professional Licensure

Per Title 34 - Education, the following programs may have pre-requisite requirements for licensure within the student's home state. For information about state licensure requirements in states other than Idaho, Washington, and Oregon, students and graduates should consult the appropriate licensure board in their home state.

Bachelor of Science in Elementary and Secondary education

Pre-licensure graduates of BA/BS programs in Elementary Education and Secondary Education Biology, Chemistry, communication Arts, Earth Science, English, Kinesiology, Mathematics, Natural Sciences Psychology or Social Sciences are eligible for the institutional recommendation that is required for a license to teach in all states that are parties to the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification's Interstate Agreement. Candidates for licensure must also meet individual state requirements.

Bachelor of Science in Nursing - Basic Track

Pre-licensure graduates of the BSN program are eligible to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN®), the national licensure exam for Registered Nurses. To be licensed as a Registered Nurse, graduates must successfully pass the NCLEX-RN® and apply for licensure directly to a state Board of Nursing. Candidates for licensure must meet individual state requirements.

Bachelor & Associate Degrees in Radiographic Science

Graduates of the Associate of Science in Radiographic Science degree program are eligible to sit for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) national certification exam. To be certified as an ARRT Radiography Technologist, graduates must successfully pass the ARRT Radiography exam. Some individual states require a state license to be eligible to work as a radiologic technologist in that state. A state license is separate from ARRT certification and registration. The state of Idaho does not require state licensing for Radiologic Technologists to practice. If you wish to obtain a state specific license, you must meet the individual state's requirements and apply directly to that state.
